**LOCATION and DESCRIPTION**

Sturgeon Bay High School is a traditional, public four year high school. The current high school building, located on the northeast side of Sturgeon Bay, was opened in 1968 and remodeled with a large addition in 1993.

The district serves the city of Sturgeon Bay (pop. 9,500) and a segment of property just north of the city along the Green Bay Shoreline. The community is predominately white, middle income residential. Sturgeon Bay’s tax base is comprised of residential, service and retail, health care, shipbuilding & repair work, tourism, and a variety of light industrial businesses.

Sturgeon Bay is located in the center of Door County, a peninsula with the waters of Green Bay and Lake Michigan surrounding it. Green Bay, Wisconsin is 43 miles to the southwest.

**CURRICULUM**

Sturgeon Bay High School utilizes a four block schedule. Each student enrolls in four 90 minute periods each day. The school year is designed around four nine week terms. A one half credit course meets for one term. A one-credit class meets for two terms. Students can earn up to eight credits per year.

**Graduation requirements:** 26 credits including 4 English credits, 3 Social Studies credits, 2 Mathematics credits, 2 Science credits, 1.5 Physical Education credits, 0.5 Health credit, 0.5 credit of Life Skills, 0.5 credit of Personal Money Management, and 40 hours of community volunteerism.

Advanced placement course:

Calculus AB and BC, US History, Art Studio, and Chemistry. Several available through distance learning or online.

Accelerated courses:

English 9, 10, American Lit, British Lit, Algebra 1, Geometry.

**Special programs:** Independent study, At-Risk Alternative Program, early graduation, supervised work experience, shared services with Door County schools and businesses, technical college articulated courses, college-level courses, and AP courses. Current courses offered in 2008-09 are listed on the back. (CON’T)

## GRADING SYSTEM

Because of the quantity and diversity of curricula available at the high school level, the following rubric is used by each teacher in determining a final letter grade.

### GRADE of "A"

Scholarship—Exceeds the requirements of the teacher  
Initiative—Contributes more than the assigned lesson  
Attitude—A positive benefit to the class  
Cooperation—Leading group activities

### GRADE of "B"

Scholarship—Accurate, complete, meets all requirements  
Initiative—Good when stimulated by desirable work  
Attitude—Shows good progress  
Cooperation—Shows good progress

### GRADE of "C"

Scholarship—Meets requirements, need encouragement  
Initiative—Uncertain and apparent only some of the time  
Attitude—Generally neutral, but not objectionable  
Cooperation—Very ordinary but willing to try

### GRADE of "D"

Scholarship—Not meeting requirements but work completed  
Initiative—Lacking  
Attitude—Slightly negative  
Cooperation—Lacking, must be pushed hard to get results

### GRADE of "F"

Evidence of Scholarship, Initiative, Attitude and Cooperation are not apparent. "F" grades earn no credit towards meeting graduation requirements.

### GRADE of "P"

Indicates student performance was adequate for passing and earning the credit for the course. No effect on grade point average or rank-in-class calculations. A grade of P does not indicate a poor performance. It is primarily used in select courses where a traditional grade is difficult to determine.
